

INFANT TRANSPORT ISOLETTE WILL TRANSPORT BABIES ACROSS MICHIGAN'S NORTHEAST & THUMB REGIONS



For more than 40 years, families in the Great Lakes Bay Region and beyond have relied on Covenant HealthCare to provide the highest level of newborn care. This year, Covenant Kids Week and the Covenant Kids Gala will support the purchase of a state-of-the-art infant isolette transporter. This equipment will provide the safest method for bringing premature babies and sick infants to Covenant from regional hospitals who rely on the specialized equipment and advanced training Covenant offers. The new transporter can be used in the LifeNet Helicopter and is compatible with MMR's updated ambulances.

"The RNICU would greatly benefit from a new AirBorne Transport Incubator in order to provide the region with critical care of our tiniest patients. This equipment will allow us to provide sick babies with the special equipment needed to survive, including high frequency ventilation and inhaled nitric oxide." Staci Boyke, Covenant HealthCare Transport Team Coordinator explains. "Every year, we transport 150-160 babies from outlying hospitals to Covenant, covering 17 counties in the region. The Airborne Transport Incubator is an essential part of each transport, and the purchase of this unit would be a tremendous impact on the care that we provide."

In the next few weeks, we will be rolling out a hospitality cart for our pediatric units. This is sponsored by Ronald McDonald House Charities and local McDonald's restaurant owner-operators. The cart, which is designed to look like a Ronald McDonald Hospitality House, will contain beverages, food items, and personal care items. The items on the cart are provided by Ronald McDonald House Charities, although other groups and individuals may also provide items for the carts. This cart will visit the Regional Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, and the Pediatric Unit of the hospital, making items on the cart available to parents, as well as staff, at no charge. The food items on the cart are not meant to replace a full meal, nor will there be hot food items, such as McDonald's French fries, on the cart. Parents are generally reluctant to leave their child alone when they are hospitalized. The food items on the cart will provide some nourishment for parents so that they do not need to leave their child's bedside to find food or beverages. The next time you visit a McDonald's restaurant, please consider leaving some change in the canister at the counter. All donations in the canisters are used for local projects such as the hospitality cart. We are deeply grateful to our friends at McDonald's on N. Michigan and in Frankenmuth, as well as Ronald McDonald House Charities, for making this wonderful project a reality.

Covenant HealthCare Foundation recently completed its Annual Giving campaign. We are very grateful to each of the donors who generously contributed to the campaign. Many of the donors designated their contribution to a specific service line within the hospital, while others stated, "please use this where it is needed most." 


Grateful Giving 2019 Supported by Community, Employees and Physicians

Dr. Jacob Ninan Educational Oncology Award Winner



Dr. Jacob Ninan practiced oncology locally for nearly four decades. He was a member of the Covenant Medical Group, helping to develop the Covenant Cancer Care Center. The opening of that center on the Covenant Mackinaw campus in 2013 was a proud moment for him. Sadly, Dr. Ninan passed away in 2015 shortly after the Covenant Cancer Care Center was opened.

In honor of Dr. Ninan's years of service and commitment to his patients, Dr. John Kosanovich and the Covenant HealthCare Foundation has established an annual Dr. Jacob Ninan Educational Oncology Award that is given to a staff member enabling that individual to attend an educational conference. 2019 saw two winners of the award, one being Latoya Brown with the Covenant Radiation Center. Latoya traveled to Houston, Texas to attend the MD Anderson Cancer Network Symposium from October 12-13, 2019.

Latoya said she was in shock when she heard that she won, and it came at a perfect time as she was having a rough year. Her boyfriend was diagnosed with cancer in May of 2018, and as a dedicated employee, Latoya never missed a day of work as she supported him through his cancer battle. Latoya credits the team she works with for the support they provided her during this difficult time. As of the writing of this article, her boyfriend is doing well.

Latoya's goal for the conference was to learn how to take better care of oncology patients. One topic she found very informative was a presentation on sepsis, as she had two patients present with this condition before she attended the conference. Latoya was excited to be able to take the knowledge she gained from the conference and share it with her colleagues at the Covenant Radiation Center. Another point of emphasis from the conference was to continue to educating patients throughout the course of their treatment. Patients are given so much information at first that it is easy to forget important information later.

Overall, Latoya said this experience was a blast and that she had an amazing time. Feeling refreshed and motivated when she got home, Latoya said she is still smiling about the trip and all she learned. Congratulations Latoya!

Covenant HealthCare Earns Top Hospital Award

Nationally recognized for our achievements in patient safety and quality, Covenant HealthCare was named a Top Teaching Hospital, one of the most competitive honors American hospitals can receive. The Top Hospital designation is awarded by The Leapfrog Group, a national watchdog organization of employers and other purchasers focused on health care safety and quality.

The Top Hospital Award comes following Covenant's third consecutive "A" Hospital Safety Grade, also from The Leapfrog Group.

"To be one of only five hospitals in the State of Michigan to receive this honor is quite an achievement," says Dr. Michael Sullivan, Vice President of Performance Improvement/Chief Medical Officer. "At Covenant, the focus is to put patients at the center of everything we do. As part of our organizational culture, safe, quality care is our top priority."

About 2,100 hospitals around the country were considered for the award. Among those, Covenant HealthCare received a Top Teaching distinction. A total of 120 hospitals were selected as Top Hospitals, including:

- 10 Top Children's Hospitals
- 37 Top General Hospitals
- 18 Top Rural Hospitals
- 55 Top Teaching Hospitals

Performance across many areas of hospital care is considered in establishing the qualifications for the award, including infection rates, practices for safer surgery, maternity care, and the hospital's capacity to prevent medication errors. The rigorous standards are defined in each year's Top Hospital Methodology.

To qualify for the Top Hospitals distinction, hospitals must rank top among peers in the 2019 Leapfrog Hospital Survey, which assesses hospital performance on the highest known standards for quality and patient safety and achieve top performance in its category.


