

MD Anderson is ranked #1 in cancer care in the U.S. News & World Report's annual "Best Hospitals" survey.



The **Commission on Cancer** (COC) recognizes Covenant Cancer Care Center for our commitment to provide comprehensive, high-quality, multidisciplinary, individualized care. COC program standards require facilities to create meaningful processes for implementation of patient-centered care.



Our accreditation by the **National Accreditation Program for Breast Cancers** (NAPBC) means we are voluntarily committed to providing the highest standards of care to patients with breast diseases. We marked another significant milestone in 2019 as the beautifully remodeled Covenant Radiation Center was unveiled featuring an additional Elekta Versa HD<sup>TM</sup> Linear Accelerator to accommodate more patients for daily treatment. The Covenant Radiation Center has the only Elekta Versa HD with a cloud-based Brainlab/ Exactrac in the United States. The expanded capabilities of this technology allow us to provide state-of-the-art cancer treatment to more patients in our community.

Each year, we conduct outreach programs to educate the community about various types of cancer, the risk factors involved, prevention strategies, and how early detection can improve outcomes for treatment and survival. In 2019, our outreach efforts were received by over 10,798 community members.

Moving into 2020, we are continuing to expand patient access to supportive and palliative care services, as well as increasing our offerings of clinical trials. Continued expansion of our research program is one of our top priorities.



# TOP TEN CANCERS TREATED AT COVENANT HEALTHCARE




# **TOP FIVE SITES BY SEX**





# **CANCER SCREENINGS OFFER PEACE OF MIND**

At Covenant Cancer Care Center, we focus on the prevention, early detection and treatment of cancer.

#### **Breast Cancer**

Getting annual mammograms beginning at age 40 is key to the best outcomes. Consider these facts:

- 3D mammography is available at all Covenant breast screening locations to best aid in the protection against breast cancer.
- About 1 in 8 American women (12.4 percent) will develop invasive breast cancer in her lifetime.
- Breast cancer typically produces no symptoms when the tumor is small and most easily treated.
- Mammography has helped reduce breast cancer mortality in the U.S. by nearly 40 percent since 1990.

#### **Lung Cancer**

Screening for lung cancer is done with Low-Dose Computerized Tomography (LDCT). Quick and painless, it is performed without using x-ray dye or contrast. Consider these facts:

- In 2019, 1,119 LDCT screenings were performed at Covenant. Out of these screenings, 14 cancers were found.
- Lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States.
- Because lung cancer is often not found until it is at an advanced stage, nearly 71 percent of those who develop it will die from the disease.
- Adults between the age of 55-77 who are current, heavy cigarette smokers or have quit smoking within the past 15 years are at high risk for lung cancer. Someone who has smoked about 1 pack a day for 30 years is considered a heavy smoker.

#### **Colorectal Cancer**

Screening for colorectal cancer is done either with a stool-based test or with a colonoscopy. Consider these facts:

- Colorectal cancer is the second-leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the U.S.
- Colorectal cancer typically produces no symptoms when the tumor is small and most easily treated.
- When it is found at an early stage, the 5-year relative survival rate is 90 percent.
- Regular screening can even prevent colorectal cancer. With a colonoscopy, doctors can find and remove
  polyps before they turn into cancer.
- Patients age 50-79 should undergo regular screenings.

#### **Registered Dietitian**

The registered dietitian provides medical nutrition therapy to aid patients in coping with the side effects of treatments and the cancer itself. This therapy is essential in helping them maintain weight, increase strength and recover as quickly as possible. Our registered dietitian facilitates community education classes and meets with patients one-on-one.

#### **Nurse Navigators**

The role of the navigator is to identify possible barriers to care, and work with the patient, their family and the clinical care team to provide a team-based care plan. Our navigators help by making the complicated more understandable, the overwhelming more manageable and the overall health experience patient-centered. The navigators help patients understand their diagnosis and treatment, assist them in setting up appointments and connect them to beneficial community and hospital-based resources.

# **COVENANT RADIATION CENTER**

- Offers state-of-the-art technology including Stereotactic Ablative Radiosurgery (SABR), Intensity Modulated Radiotherapy (IMRT) and Image Guided Radiotherapy (IGRT).
- Our SABR technology targets tumors in the body (lung, liver, spine) with high doses of radiation and minimum damage to surrounding healthy tissue.
- Has the only Elekta Versa HD with a cloud-based Brainlab/Exactrac in the United States. This allows us to treat more complex cases including multiple individual brain lesions (instead of whole-brain treatment) to preserve healthy brain tissue.
- The only center in the region to offer Xofigo®, an injection used to treat bone metastasis from prostate cancer that no longer responds to hormonal or surgical treatment to lower testosterone.
- Has Brachytherapy for gynecologic and skin cancer. This allows placement of a sealed radiation source, delivering a higher treatment dose to a specific area.
- Utilizes the "gold standard" with frameless, non-invasive positioning devices.
- Participates in the Michigan Radiation Oncology Quality Consortium (MROQC). Our goal is to identify best practices in radiation therapy that minimize side effects patients may experience from radiation treatment.
- Typically sees non-emergent patients for a consult within 48 hours of referral.



The Covenant Radiation Center expansion was completed January 2019. This allowed us to add an additional linear accelerator which offers patients better access to the latest technology.

# **CANCER RESEARCH TEAM – ONCOLOGY FOCUS**

Covenant Cancer Care Center has made increasing clinical trial offerings one of the top priorities over the past several years. In 2019 we continued to expand our research program with the help of the Central Research Team (pictured below). Covenant HealthCare is Michigan's first and only certified member of MD Anderson Cancer Network\*, a program of MD Anderson Cancer Center. Through MD Anderson we completed the application to join the NRG, which is an oncology non-profit research organization formed to conduct clinical research and to broadly disseminate study results for informing clinical decision making and healthcare policy. This will lead to increased clinical trial offerings at Covenant for our oncology patients in 2020.

#### **Benefits of Conducting Clinical Trials**

- Research contributes to the expanding knowledge base of medicine and provides physicians/investigators the opportunity to offer patients the latest cutting-edge therapies.
- Research has resulted in hundreds of innovations that offer earlier diagnosis of illness, minimized side effects, less demanding administration processes and better outcomes.

#### 2019 Research Highlights

- TORAY study enrolled 101 patients (Dr. Sussan Bays, principal investigator; Dr. Joseph Contino, sub investigator). In this study, blood samples and information are collected to determine if changes in blood miRNAs can predict breast cancer at biopsy for women who had breast imaging suspicious for breast cancer. If data from the study supports this, a blood test could potentially be developed eliminating the need for biopsies in the future.
- TheraSphere study enrolled 4 patients (Dr. Michael Warren, principal investigator). This radiotherapy treatment for hepatocellular carcinoma consists of millions of microscopic, radioactive glass microspheres being infused into the arteries that feed liver tumors.
- Karyopharm Therapeutics Endometrial Cancer study opened enrollment goal 2 patients (Dr. Gregory Sutton, principal investigator). A phase 3 randomized, double-blind trial of maintenance with selinexor/placebo after combination chemotherapy for patients
- OnPro Kit study opened enrollment goal 60 patients (Dr. Binu Malhotra, principal investigator). Prospective observational study to estimate the incidence of febrile neutropenia among subjects with non-myeloid malignancies at high risk for febrile neutropenia.

• Adynxx ADYX-006 study opened – enrollment goal 6 patients (Dr. Sussan Bays, principal investigator). A phase 2 randomized, doubleblind, placebo-controlled study to evaluate the safety and efficacy of a single intrathecal preoperative administration of brivoligide injection in patients with a pain catastrophizing scale score >16 undergoing mastectomy with immediate tissue expander or implant placement.

# **SURVIVORSHIP PROGRAM**

Over 200 Survivorship Care Plans (SCP) were distributed to Cancer Survivors in 2019.

#### What is a Survivorship Care Plan?

A SCP is designed to guide patients through difficulties that may arise following treatment. It is a written record of a patient's cancer treatment history and recommendations for follow up. The plan discusses further cancer screening, risk reduction, cancer prevention, management of late side effects and a psychosocial report.


# **2019 COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS**
