TAKING A MOMENT OF REFLECTION

There have been so many wonderful moments at Covenant HealthCare Foundation this past year, due in large part to the generosity of our donors. As 2015 comes to a close, it seems appropriate to reflect upon them. In April, the 6th Covenant Kids Telethon successfully took place at Mid-Michigan Children's Museum. Families came from across the region to share their stories of time spent at Covenant while their child's medical needs were addressed. Sponsors of independent fundraising events spoke about their reasons for becoming involved with Covenant Kids. At the end of the Telethon, over \$100,000 had been raised.

Covenant HealthCare's Red Carpet events took place in mid-August at Apple Mountain Resort. You may recall that in 2013 we introduced Crumpets and Croquet into the line-up of Red Carpet events. This event has grown tremendously! This year, participants included Disney villains and heroines, Dr. Seuss characters, bobby sox dancers, a bevy of princesses, and many more characters enjoying an afternoon of croquet. A number of teams have already begun planning their costumes for next year. Who knew that an event created as an alternative activity for non-golfers could bring so much enthusiasm to a fundraising event? At the end of Red Carpet, our donors and participants raised almost \$100,000 for our Breast Health Center and Hospice programs.

I would be remiss if I overlooked our Second Century reception in May where we distributed 11 scholarships to high school students as well as 4 scholarships to employees looking to further their nursing education. This would not have been possible without the generosity of our many donors. Attendees frequently comment on how intellectually inadequate they feel upon listening to all the accomplishments of our high school recipients. This year, one of our students had already received 2 patents! If the caliber of our scholarship winners is any indication of what we can expect from the next generation of medical professionals, our future is in extraordinary hands.

As we prepare for 2016, we look forward to seeing many of you at the next Covenant Kids Telethon, Red Carpet, or Second Century event. Your support makes you a partner in providing Covenant's extraordinary care for every generation. May the coming year bring you and your loved ones peace, prosperity, and extraordinary health.

In 2015, the Covenant Cancer Care Center shared some big announcements, including becoming Michigan's first and only certified member of MD Anderson Cancer Network,® a program of MD Anderson Cancer Center. A world-renowned leader in cancer care, The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center is currently the number 1 cancer hospital according to *U.S. News and World Report's* "Best Hospitals" survey. Covenant offers patients access to the latest in evidence-based guidelines from one of the leading cancer centers in the U.S.... close to home...right here in Saginaw.

And now Covenant has the latest radiation therapy system in our newly renovated Covenant Radiation Center, the Elekta Versa HD Linear Accelerator. This machine offers leading-edge technology and the newest treatment techniques to deliver care to our community.

In November, Covenant Radiation Center hosted media, current patients, survivors, physicians, and community leaders at a ribbon-cutting and open house. Attendees were able to learn about this new technology that offers ultra-precise targeting, decreased treatment times and increased patient comfort. Covenant is fortunate to be home to one of only two of these machines in Michigan.

Versa HD allows safe and efficient delivery of conventional radiation treatment to treat a broad spectrum of tumors throughout the body. It also allows treatment of highly complex cancers that require extreme targeting precision. The expanded capabilities of this technology present new opportunities to provide state-of-the-art cancer treatment to more patients in our community.

With Versa HD, Covenant will open the door to innovative cancer treatments for patients in the Great Lakes Bay Region and beyond.

Versa HD leverages the latest technology to enable sophisticated approaches to traditionally challenging cases. The system's patented technology allow precise targeting of the tumor, allowing Covenant Radiation Center clinicians to administer higher doses that can enhance treatment effectiveness, while protecting critical structures such as the heart, spine, or bladder. The result is highly precise treatments with shorter treatment times, and the ability to offer highly advanced treatments while minimizing side effects and enhancing our patients' quality of life.

Shop the Covenant Gift Shops

Covenant HealthCare Foundation operates three gift shops and a Coffee Clinic. Gift shops are located in the Cooper, Harrison and Mackinaw campuses with a Coffee Clinic located inside the Cooper Gift Shop. The shops are mainly staffed by our wonderful hospital volunteers as well as a handful of staff members.

The shops carry a wide variety of products to meet the needs of patients, visitors and employees of the hospital. The best part of the gift shops and Coffee Clinic is that any profits made go back into the hospital. 50% of the profits is used by the Foundation for their various hospital improvement efforts. The other 50% is given to the Covenant HealthCare Volunteers who determine how they want to use the money to best benefit the hospital.

#5 Gifting from Assets

BEQUESTS

A bequest is the act making a gift from future assets rather than current income. Generally, it is a simple statement in your will or provision in your trust that provides for a specific percentage or amount from your estate to be directed to Covenant HealthCare upon your death. You may add this statement (codicil) to your will at any time. A bequest can also be made from a life insurance policy. You simply specify Covenant as the beneficiary or a percentage beneficiary. A life insurance policy can be a very cost effective means to provide for a future gift.

If you choose to name Covenant HealthCare as a beneficiary from your estate or life insurance policy you can specify the programs or areas your gift will support. Please let Covenant HealthCare Foundation know if you have included Covenant HealthCare in your gifting plans so your wishes will be faithfully carried out.

If you choose to name Covenant HealthCare as a beneficiary of your estate or life insurance policy you can be specific about the programs or areas your gift will support. Covenant HealthCare Foundation would like to know if you have included Covenant HealthCare in your estate plans so your wishes will be faithfully carried out.

PUT YOUR IRA PAYOUT TO WORK FOR COVENANT HEALTHCARE

People age 70 ½ and older are required to take a required minimum distribution from their IRA based on the value of the account(s) and life expectancy. These mandatory distributions are included in your adjusted gross income and, in all likelihood, you would have a tax liability on them. The Charitable IRA Rollover allows you to make donations directly to a charitable organization from your IRA without counting them as part of your adjusted gross income.

SOME KEY POINTS TO REMEMBER:

- You must be at least 70 ½ years of age when the distribution/gift is made.
- The gift must be made directly to the qualified charity.
- Your gift counts toward your required minimum distribution for 2015.
- A consultation with your financial advisor is highly recommended.
