

MIRACLES HAPPEN HERE 11.2 Ounce Micro Preemie Grows, and Goes Home







Born on June 29, 2020 at 320 grams (just over 11 ounces), Harper Rose's due date was supposed to be October 23. On November 4, she was able to go home with her family after a 128-day stay in the Covenant HealthCare Regional Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (RNICU), making her one of our smallest patients to be successfully discharged.

Harper's parents, Patrick Schultz and Emilee Wendzik, are medical professionals, both Respiratory Therapists. Schultz said that this was a "glimmer of hope" in an otherwise very difficult year.

Dr. Martin Nwankwo, a Pediatrix-affiliated Neonatologist at Covenant HealthCare, says, "This is the smallest baby that we've ever resuscitated, and to see her grow from where we started to going home now in reasonably good shape, it's mind-boggling for us. We've never done this before. And, to be honest with you, half the hospitals in the United States would not have attempted this."

"It's nothing short of a miracle," says Schultz.

A Silver Lining Amidst the Pandemic

Two important reasons include protection of your assets and determining who you entrust to make medical decisions on your behalf. Not having a legal plan can leave an estate vulnerable to an often lengthy, unnecessarily contentious, and stressful court process of establishing asset distribution, and may leave your loved ones without authority to make medical decisions on your behalf if you become unable to do so.

Why put off creating an estate plan any longer? Maybe choosing to finally set up an estate plan to protect your asset distribution and medical wishes will be your COVID-19 silver lining.

"All of our lives changed dramatically late last spring and early summer as Covid19 entered our lives. When I received my notice that my volunteer services were being suspended for a while to protect not only myself, but also others, I was somewhat upset. I loved volunteering at Covenant and did not want to stay home, but I knew it was necessary for the protection of all of us. When the time was right and I received my call asking if I was ready to return to "work", my response was "I am ready and on my way." It was so great to see so many of the staff that had become friends over the years in the gift shop. Knowing how much they appreciate the services offered to them on a daily basis made the joy of returning even better. The jokes, the laughter, the friendship all were still there. As the hospital reopened many services and the corridors were welcoming back patients and visitors, the need for volunteers in the gift shop became even more evident. Comments from the public concerning the care family members were receiving during this difficult time made me realize just how important Covenant is to the region. I realized that returning to Covenant had a bigger impact on me than it did on those I served. I fully realized that I am a part of something so much bigger and that is the Covenant family. Combining comments from visitors with those I overheard from the staff, I knew that our region is fortunate to have Covenant. On a personal note I found out just what the Covenant staff means to the families it serves when my brother became a patient and was treated for Covid by our staff. The disease ended up taking my brother's life, but the care and concern of the staff to our family and my brother will go with us forever. What an honor to be part of the Covenant family. It takes many people to provide the necessary services to our families. Thank you, Covenant, for allowing me and all the other volunteers to be a part of this great organization. I am so glad to be back with you."

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
