SUPPORTING COVENANT HEALTHCARE, **OUR STAFF & OUR PATIENTS**

2021 brought a year of opportunity for Volunteer Services. While we didn't break records on number of volunteers and hours served, volunteers had the opportunity to serve in unique and creative ways for the organization. As we started to see many of our volunteers return to service, the demand for volunteer support was felt and needed throughout the organization.

From December 2020 – June 2021, 57 volunteers provided 1,400 hours of support to the Covenant HealthCare community COVID-19 Vaccine Clinics and prep work to make the clinics a success. Volunteers, local schools and churches made cards and wrote letters to support staff and patients during some of Covenant's hardest days in the fight against the pandemic.

From July 2020 - June 2021, 271 volunteers provided 65,000 hours of service. While many of the services where volunteers serve may have been restricted during the year, there was still an opportunity to impact the patient experience at Covenant. Volunteers documented over 1600 patient encounters in fiscal year 2021.

Most notably, volunteers served patients through: Sacrament of the Sick: 109 Discharges: 266 Flower/patient mail deliveries: 410 **McNally Shuttle Rides: 47** Wayfinding: 800

Many Volunteers choose to provide service at home, spending time making handmade items for Covenant patients. In fiscal year 2021, Volunteers made over 300 items for our patients.
